- 1) The Name line will again be first, followed by the shortened Date line. Please sign and date your chit before entering your purchases.
- 2) The Lite Bites quantity is now after the Sunday or Monday identifier in order to track each event.
- 3) The quantity for each type of Wednesday Night Dinner (Beef, Fish, Chicken, Vegetarian) follows, rather than precedes each type of dinner.

We have changed banks from Bank of America to Chemical Bank, mainly due to the latter's ability to more easily accommodate changes in IVTC's roster of volunteers with signing authority. *-Tom Roberts, Treasurer* 

#### Purchasing Beer, Wine & Spirits at IVTC

With so many new members joining the club, the Bar Committee thought it would be helpful to share the following information on purchasing beer, wine, and spirits at IVTC.

**Beer.** The club has two designations for beer, premium and non-premium. Our premium beers include any beer in a **bottle**, plus Redhook ESB and a rotating craft beer (Mad Hatter IPA at this writing) on tap – prices are \$2.50 for a bottle or a glass, and \$10 for a pitcher. (Stella hard cider is also available for \$2.50 a bottle.) Our non-premium beers include any beer in a **can**, and Labatt Blue and Labatt Blue Light on tap – prices are \$1.75 for a can or glass, and \$7 for a pitcher. The two short tap handles for the Labatts are a reminder that these are non-premium beers, while the two tall tap handles are a reminder that the ESB and the rotating craft beer are premium beers.

### **News and Notes**

Wines by the Bottle. The majority of our wines can only be purchased by the bottle. Our wine list has about forty wines from around the world at a variety of price points. The prices are on the wine list, and on the back of each bottle - just fill in the price on your chit. We keep a varied selection of red wines available at the right side of the bar in a small wine rack - if you want to make sure that a particular wine is available, just ask Jim Harvey, Chris Foster or Bob Mobley. A selection of chilled rosé, white, and sparkling wines is in the stainless steel fridge in the kitchen, top shelf at left. You are welcome to split the price of a bottle with a friend or friends - simply fill out your chits accordingly. Also, you are welcome to take home your partly consumed bottle - just recork it well, and place it in the trunk of your car for the ride home, so as not to run afoul of the open container law.

Wines by the Glass. We offer one red wine and two white wines by the glass on a day-today basis: Black Box Cabernet is located on the bar, and Black Box Chardonnay and Black Box Sauvignon Blanc are in the stainless steel fridge in the kitchen, at \$3.75 a glass. At events with a bartender (Wednesday Night Dinners and THIS Parties), a limited selection of bottled wines are offered by the glass: Concannon Cabernet, Alamos Chardonnay, and Guilhem Rosé. Additionally, at Wednesday Night Dinners, Jim Harvey features a premium red and white wine of the night, by the glass, as a special offer to encourage members to try something new or unfamiliar from our wine list. Leftover partial bottles from these events may be purchased by the glass (reds below the bar, whites in the reach-in cooler), but if you want to open up a new bottle, you must purchase the entire bottle.

**Corkage Fee.** The Wine Committee does its best to provide something for every taste on our wine list, and we are open to your suggestions. But we also allow members to bring in their own wines, provided they pay a corkage fee of \$8 per bottle which should be recorded on a chit.

Liquor & Mixed Drinks. Mixed drinks are available for purchase at events where bartender John Cummings is working (Wednesday Night Dinner and THIS Parties), at two prices: \$4 for well drinks and \$4.50 for premium brands. Sometimes Drew Cook or Jim Harvey volunteers to mix drinks at more informal events. At non-bartender events and day-to-day, airplane liquor bottles of Smirnoff vodka, Tanqueray gin and Jameson's Irish Whisky are available for \$4.50 per bottle; help yourself to mixers in the reach-in cooler.

**Chits.** We require that our members fill out a chit at the time of purchase and before consuming any of the beverages the Club offers. This practice helps to assure that items consumed are properly chitted, and helps to maintain the integrity of our self-reporting chit system.

**Guests.** If you have a guest at the club, please accompany them to the bar and fill out a chit for their drink. Most guests are not familiar with our chit system, and it is unfair to John, our bartender, to ask him to chase after people who have not filled out a chit.

**Last Call.** At IVTC we are compelled to follow state law and the Michigan Liquor Control Commission. No alcoholic beverages may be purchased after 2am, and no alcoholic beverages may be consumed after 2:30am.
